Slide 1 – Transfer Orientation

Welcome to NCTC! As a transfer student, we want you to have a great experience while you're here—whether your goal is to complete a semester's worth of transfer credit or to complete one of our Associate Degrees or certificates. We hope your time at NCTC is productive and positive, and to help you out we compiled some information to make this transition easier.

Slide 2 – Welcome to NCTC

NCTC has a rich history and was established in 1924. We serve 3 counties and 6 campuses in the North Central Texas area.

Slide 3 – Enrollment Steps

Our Admissions Office e-mailed you your myNCTC username and password, as well as a list of other requirements, such as missing transcripts and proof of Bacterial Meningitis Vaccine. We may need official TSI scores, if that information is not posted on your transcript.

Slide 4 – Mane Stop

Please be sure to speak with an Enrollment Guide in the Mane Stop if you have any questions or concerns about the enrollment process. One quick note—complete the enrollment steps as soon as possible. Classes in prime times can fill up fast. Make it easy for yourself; be proactive and take care of business early and fast! 😊

Slide 5 – Time to Register!

You may take classes at any of our campuses, including online classes.

Please understand that some of our degree and certificate programs may be offered at specific campuses. For example, students interested in completing our Nursing degree would be taking the bulk of their classes on the Gainesville campus, where the program is housed.

Slide 7 – Don't Forget...

Also, don't forget to fill out the Transcript Evaluation Request Form. We can't stress this point strongly enough! This step is crucial for our transfer students. We need to know what credits you've already completed and where they're counting. We want to make sure you don't repeat courses unnecessarily.

We also want to keep you on track for the goal at hand, and the way to do that accurately is to have your previous transcripts evaluated. This process is not automatic and can take several weeks, so take care of this step ASAP!

Slide 8 – GPA

While we may transfer in your credit from another school, NCTC does not transfer in your previous GPA. Each university may calculate GPA differently. They may also treat repeated coursework differently. It's important that you check with your future university to see how retaking classes at NCTC will affect your cumulative GPA.

Slide 9 – Finish What You Started, or Start Something New!

If your goal is to complete CORE classes that easily transfer to a Texas college or university, NCTC has you covered. We also offer an Associate of Art and an Associate of Science degree that can be customized for your needs!

Slide 10 – Academic Pathways

Academic pathways are provided to shape a student's educational experience and provide the best combination of classes (both core options and electives) that align with a student's intended major at a four-year university.

Slide 11 – Keep in Mind...

Check Course Equivalencies

Classes may have different course numbers than those at your university.

Example: ACNT1303 Introduction to Accounting ≠ ACCT2010 Accounting Principles I

Pre-requisite Issues

If your transcript evaluation hasn't been completed yet, then you will need to see an advisor if you are trying to enroll in a class that has a pre-requisite that you've already met.

Slide 12 – Feeling Lost?

We recommend you meet with an advisor to create a degree audit, which will help serve as road map of what classes you need to take. It's important to note that even if you transfer in everything that is needed for a degree at NCTC, you will still need to complete a certain amount of residency hours in order for us to award you a degree.

Slide 13 – Meet with your Advisor/Coach!

All students will be assigned an advisor, who is listed on the degree audit. We recommend you to make an appointment to meet with your assigned advisor. Scan the QR code or visit the link on the PDF to make an appointment to meet with your assigned advisor.
